Reading: Students will be working on author's purpose, using context clues to determine the meaning of unknown words, inferencing, determining fact and opinion, and problem/solution.

Math: Students will be learning how to multiply by regrouping, along with different techniques to multiply two digit by two/three digit numbers. It is very important that your student knows their math facts. Knowing their math facts is a necessary skill that they will use for the rest of the school year. We will be practicing them in the classroom as well.

Language: Students will be practicing sentence structure, recognizing nouns and words with plural endings.

Social Studies: Students will be learning map skills. Weekly quizzes will still be given on Thursdays.
